BETTING DISPUTES — FLAT

The Bookmakers' Supervisor will attend at an office to the south of the ring (near light horse stalls) ten (10) minutes after each race to deal with "disputed bets."

"PLACE TOTE" DIVIDENDS will be paid on the basis 1, 2, 3 when eight or more starters are left in the race and 1, 2, when there are five and not more than seven starters.

DOUBLE TOTALIZATOR

DOUBLES TICKETS at 4/- each may be purchased at "Special Windows" set apart for same in the Totalizator Buildings, and the amount invested will constitute one pool less commission and fractions.

Tickets for the Double will be sold for the horse chosen to win the First Race of the Double up to the time of starting of that race.

Holders of winning tickets must then change their tickets for the horse or horses they wish to support for the Second Race of the Double.

In the event of the winner of the First Race of the Double not being backed, holders of tickets on the second horse must change their tickets for the horse or horses they wish to support for the Second Race of the Double. If the second horse is not backed then holders of tickets on the third horse must change their tickets. If neither first, second nor third horses are backed in the First Race of the Double all investments will be refunded less commission and fractions.

TWO DIVIDENDS will be paid when eight (8) or more horses start in the Second Race of Double—80 per cent. First Horse; 20 per cent. Second Horse.

Investors failing to change winning tickets on the First Race of the Double before the Double Totalizator closes cannot claim a refund.

If a horse is scratched or declared not in Starter's Hands for the first race a refund will be made.

If a horse is scratched or declared not in Starter's Hands for the second race after the ticket is changed, the holder may change his ticket for a runner, or a refund will be made.

If any event should happen or circumstances arise which is not provided for by the Totalizator Rules, the matter shall be dealt with in such manner as the Committee may determine.

Additional Rules Adopted November 30, 1936

DEAD HEATS

In the event of a dead heat for first place in the First Race of the Double, the holder of a ticket on any horse running such dead heat will have the right to change his ticket for a ticket in the Second Race of the Double.

In the event of a dead heat for first place in the Second Race of the Double, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (1) The amount available for dividends will be divided into as many parts as there are horses running such dead heat, and each such part will be divided equally among the holders of tickets on each such horse.
- (2) If two horses run the dead heat and tickets are held on only one of them, the amount available for dividend will be divided among the holders of tickets on such horse unless there are at least eight starters in the race, in which case such holders will divide 80 per cent. of the amount available for dividend, and holders of tickets on the third horse will divide the remaining 20 per cent. thereof.
- (3) If three horses run the dead heat and tickets are held on only two of them, the amount available for dividend shall be divided as if such two horses had run the dead heat, and if tickets are held only on one of the horses running a triple dead heat, the amount available for dividend will be divided among the holders of such tickets.

In the event of a dead heat for second or third places in the Second Race of the Double, the amount (if any) available for dividend among the holders of tickets on the second or third horses (as the case may be) will be divided into as many parts as there are horses running such dead heat, and each such part will be divided equally among the holders of tickets on each such horse.

ABRIDGED STEWARDS' REPORT

SATURDAY, 27th FEBRUARY.

Stratton Hdcp. (1st div.).—TRAVIS RANJ (G. Schluter) stood flat-footed on the mark, and caused interference to PEGGY ADAIR (S. Boscence) and POWER STRIKE (A. Archman). A warning was issued regarding the behaviour of TRAVIS RANJ.

Stratton Hdcp. (2nd div.).—When VAN JOY (C. Webster) broke badly and fell back through the field, he was contacted by PANA LAD, whose driver, G. Loizeau, was unseated. The occurrence was accidental.

The nomination of VAN JOY was refused for Wayville for one month.

ROSE'S SON (K. Webster) and VIE'S IMAGE (M. Allan) were back from the barrier when it was released and lost ground.

Inter-Dominion Championship (3rd heat—1st div.).—An enquiry was opened and adjourned into the accident in which W. Picken (LADY JOSS) was unseated at the turn into the home straight on the last lap.

Matson Handicap.—GAYNORS GIFT (C. Cameron) broke without interference and fell back through the field, causing interference to several runners.

Inter-Dominion Championship (3rd heat—2nd div.).—STAR STRANGER (W. Bowyer) and MECCA CHIEF (A. Picken) galloped from the barrier and failed to settle down for a considerable time. In future they will start from the rear of the field.

After questioning G. Rothacker (WILBUR'S HOPE), F. W. Foy (BEAU DON) and R. Ryan (ANDI), the Stewards were of the opinion that when BEAU DON came outside WILBUR'S HOPE, this horse "ran in" and contacted a wheel of ANDI'S gig, causing this horse to break. In the mix-up STAR STRANGER, MECCA CHIEF, VANIREE and TENNESSEE SKY received interference.

Inter-Dominion Championship (3rd heat—3rd div.).—A mix-up at the northern bend on the last lap was found to be caused by FLOODLIGHT (D. Cornish)—which was travelling very fast—"lugging in" slightly on BRUCE HALL (H. Mazoudier), causing this horse to contact VICTORY DALE and ERINGA. Cornish was warned to exercise greater care when coming from the rear of the field.

Rice Handicap.—OLYMPIC STAR (J. May) and ADMIRER'S KISS (G. Heath) dwelt badly when the barrier was released, causing interference to HUSHYLE'S VAN (R. Williams). Warnings were issued the connections of both horses.

Extracts from Regulations under Lottery and Gaming Acts

CONTROL OF QUEUES.

7. (1) Persons approaching any window of a Totalizator shall form up in a queue in single file extending away from such window.

(2) When any such queue has been formed, no person shall approach the window to which such queue leads except as a member of such queue.

8. No person shall—

- (a) push into any such queue or join the same except at the rear end thereof;
- (b) take precedence of any person who from his position has a prior right in any queue.
- (c) stand or walk between any queues so formed, or within four yards of either side of the outside queues;
- (d) pass money or a ticket to any person in any queue.

9. Every person shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable direction by any member of the Police Force as to:—

- (a) the manner of approaching to or departing from any totalizator;
- (b) the conduct of such person in the vicinity of any totalizator.

PENALTIES.

10. Any person who contravenes any provision of regulation 7, 8, or 9 hereof, whether by omission or commission, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every breach of such provision.

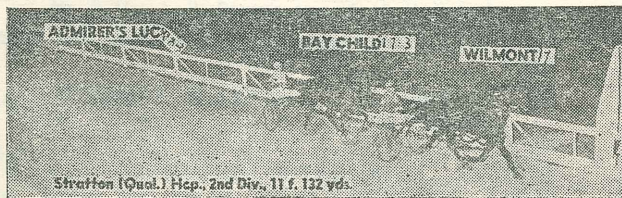

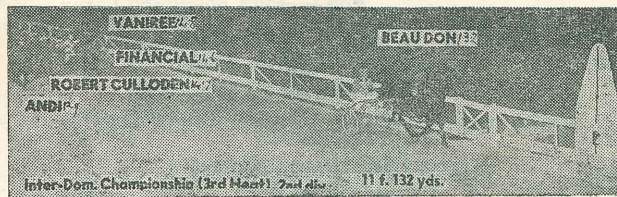
