



Notice to Totalisator Patrons

TOTALISATOR UNCLAIMED DIVIDENDS

Totalisator dividends from the PREVIOUS meet-

ing may be collected at:-

Late Dividend windows in the Paddock "A" and Leger "A" Totalisator houses from one half-hour before the first race until the start of the second race.

Late Dividends from EARLIER meetings may be collected at the offices of the Automatic Totalisators Limited, 472 Bourke Street, Melbourne, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and thereafter each day for a period of one month from date of meeting (Saturdays and Public Holidays excepted).

The Indicator situated over or near each Totalisator House will show odds for both win and place.

"PLACE" bets are 1, 2, 3 when eight or more horses remain in a race when the Totalisator is opened, and 1, 2 when not fewer than five nor more than seven horses remain in when the Totalisator is opened.

The "PLACE" Totalisator will not be opened when four horses or fewer start in a race.

Warning bells will be rung outside the Totalisator Houses 15 minutes and 5 minutes before each race.

TOTALISATOR REGULATION

No person under the age of 21 years shall be permitted to bet on the Totalisator, vide Section 108 (1) of Racing Act, 1958.

STEWARDS' REPORT

MEETING, 13th FEBRUARY, 1964.

RODNEY THREE-YEAR-OLD HANDICAP: A warning was issued to "Favourite Way" (V. Geary), which began badly. "Sir Ronald" (W. Allaway) and "Chamarlane" (D. Mann, Junr.) began slowly.

"Yankee Look" (D. Crouch) broke without interference in

each of the last two laps. A warning was issued.

"Dale Junior" (K. Raw) lugged badly throughout the race. QUALIFYING STAKES (First Division): For slowing the field too sharply at the turn into the back straight in the second lap, and thereby causing interference to "Yelanak" (G. Harpley), "Googana" (L. Welsh) and "Donbros" (G. Gath), J. Le Sueur, the driver of "Demon Hal", was fined £10. J. Hoban, "Silver Clan", was severely reprimanded for shifting from the rails too sharply at the turn out of the back straight in the last lap, thereby causing "Googana" (L. Welsh) to break.

DUMAS HANDICAP: The nomination of "Joca's Boy" (A. Gath), which broke during the running, was refused in the metropolitan area until 12th March. Warnings were issued to "Shannon Lad" (A. Simons), "Bonnie Ian" (H. Craig), "Our Noble" (I. Jones) and "Lucky Song" (A. K. Holmes), which broke without interference. A warning was issued to "Stylemaster" (R. A. Robinson), which paced from the barrier.

master" (R. A. Robinson), which paced from the parrier. CARLSON HANDICAP: "Late Addition" (R. Simons) and "Faye Maree" (J. Hargreaves) began slowly.

T. Utting, "Assiduous", and D. Dove, "Pakeha", were questioned regarding an incident as these horses passed the post at the finish. After taking evidence from both drivers, and acting on their own observations, the stewards were satisfied that, although these horses were tight in the last half furlong, no incident of an untoward nature took place.

DYSON HANDICAP: As "Lassie McGregor" (D. Fitzpatrick) made a fast run on the rails in the first lap, she had to be checked as "Bannock Raider" (G. D. Wilson) shifted into the rails. It mixed its gait for a few strides. "Lasata" (G. Rothacker) broke in the last lap when slightly squeezed for room. "Free Clan" (B. Morgan), "Jive" (C. Martin) and "Bannock Raider" (G. D. Wilson) received

checks from this incident.

D. Townley, "Grande Garnison", was instructed not to drive

too close to the horse on the inside in future races. In future, "State Law" (J. Barron), which began badly, will be excluded from the draw in standing start races. Warnings were issued to "Lassie McGregor" (D. Fitzpatrick) and "Grande Garnison" (D. Townley), which were slow away.

STEWARDS' REPORT-Continued

STATION HANDICAP: In future, "Brandy Scott" (G. D. Wilson), which began badly, checking "Lutorra" (D. Ritchie) and "Rodborough" (F Kersley), will be excluded from the draw in standing start races. "Address" (G. Rothacker) dwelt at the barrier.

MEETING, 15th FEBRUARY, 1964.

QUALIFYING STAKES: "Funspot" (C. Allen) broke without interference at the start, causing "Yelanak" (G. Harpley) to be checked and in turn check "Huckleberry" (W. Gascoigne), which broke its head check. In future, "Funspot" will be excluded from the draw in mobile barrier races.

WILEY HANDICAP: In future, "Mactavish" (B. Morgan), "Application" (K. Raw), "Rumpus" (C. Allen) and "Minzah" (J. Barron), which began badly, will be excluded from the

draw in standing start races.

POWER HANDICAP: A warning was issued to "Adios Pride" (G. Rothacker), which began badly, and to "Welburn" (F. Kersley), which broke without interference in the first lap.

MOONEE FREE-FOR-ALL: "Stylemaster" (H. Craig) broke after the start. "Pohutukawa (D. Townley) broke at 1st turn. When attempting to take an opening on the inside of "Shell-grit" (A. Phillis), which was hanging from the rails at the turn out of the back straight in the last lap, "Olympic Torch" (C. Hopkins) clipped "Shellgrit's" wheel and broke, causing "Lucky Song" (A. Holmes) and "Scotleigh" (C. Griffin) to be cheeked.

A. Phillis, "Shellgrit", was reprimanded for allowing his horse to drift from the rails throughout the race.

HOPEFUL FREE-FOR-ALL (First Division): A warning was issued to "Tarcoola" (A. Phillis), which broke after the start and hung in slightly, checking "Tiara Court" (J. Barron). "Blue Marlin" (G. D. Wilson), which was rearing when the horses lined up, was sent to the rear by the Starter. In future, "Blue Marlin" will be excluded from the draw in standing start races.

As the field checked sharply at the turn into the back straight in the first lap, "Sydray" (H. Craig) broke and was contacted by "Cele" (V. Allen), which broke. The occur-

rence was accidental.

HOPEFUL FREE-FOR-ALL (Second Division): "Red Adios" (V. Frost) and "Caricature" (G. Wilson) began slowly. A warning was issued to "Rising Flood" (S. Rothacker), which began badly.

At the turn into the home straight in the first lap "Tactile" (R. Cameron) hung in on to "Opal Chief" (K. Raw), with the result that "Opal Chief"s hind leg contacted "Tactile's" sulky wheel, causing "Opal Chief" to mix its gait for a few strides. As a result, "Western Song" (C. Allen) and "Red Adios" (V. Frost), which were trailing, suffered interference.

TROTTING CONTROL BOARD

Doubles and Quinella

- A Doubles totalisator will operate on "this and the next" for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Races. A Quinella totalisator will operate on all races.
- 2. Doubles tickets will be issued at the YELLOW windows. They will show the racebook number of the horse in the 1st leg above the racebook number of the horse in the 2nd leg. Quinella tickets will be issued at the BLUE windows, and for the last race, at the YELLOW windows also.
- 3. In selecting a Double the investor must ask for the racebook number of the horse required in the 1st leg First and then the racebook number of the horse required in the 2nd leg.
- 4. An investor may invest in a Double as many times as desired. For example, if he wishes to Couple Nos. 3 and 7 more than once he should say "Nos. 3 and 7, two tickets", or whatever number of times he requires the double.
- 5. FIELD BETTING -Certain windows will be available for Doubles and Quinella "Field" betting. In Doubles "Field" betting an investor selects one horse in any one leg of a Double with ALL the runners in the other leg. For example, a horse, say No. 7, in the first leg, could be coupled with all the horses ("the Field") in the 2nd leg, in which case the investor would ask for "No. 7 and the Field", or the investor may desire to have all runners ("the Field") in the 1st leg coupled with a horse, say No. 5, in the 2nd leg, in which case he would ask for "the Field and No. 5". The same principle applies to Quinella "Field" betting. Of course, the investor's outlay is greater, being governed by the number of horses in "the Field". A Doubles or Quinella ticket in "Field" betting can be issued just as quickly as a Single ticket for a combination of only two horses.
- In Totalisator Doubles:—

 (a) You are entitled to a REFUND of your stake —
 - (1) If your horse in the 1st leg is withdrawn, regardless of whether your horse in the 2nd leg wins or does not start; or
 - (2) If your horse in the 2nd leg is withdrawn PRIOR to the running of the 1st leg, regardless of whether your horse in the 1st leg wins or loses.
 - (b) NO REFUND is made if your horse in the 1st leg loses and your horse in the 2nd leg is scratched after the running of the 1st leg.

(c) If your horse in the 1st leg wins and your horse in the 2nd leg is withdrawn AFTER the running of the 1st leg your bet is deemed to be transferred to such other horse as the Trotting Control Board shall determine and announce prior to the running of the 2nd leg. In making its determination, the Board is required. as far as practicable to substitute for the withdrawn horse the starter which carries the greatest amount of money in combination with the winner of the 1st leg.

The foregoing shall also apply if your horse in the 2nd leg is withdrawn from a re-run of a race in which it had taken part.

7. QUINELLA (RACE PAIRS) BETTING-

This is a form of Doubles betting on any one race. A Quinella will operate on every race.

The investor may select any two horses in the race, for example, Nos. 3 and 11, and if those horses fill the first two placings, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER THEY ARE PLACED FIRST AND SECOND OR SECOND AND FIRST. the investors on Nos. 3 and 11 are entitled to collect the dividend declared on the Quinella. As in doubles betting the investor may take the whole field if he wishes (see paragraph 5). Quinella tickets are obtainable at the Blue windows and for the last race at the Yellow windows also.
